Meet the Choreographers

Zach Law Ingram | Choreographer & Artistic Director

Zach Law Ingram is from Miami, Florida, and graduated from the New World School of the Arts in New York City. During his formative years of dance training, Ingram attended the Dance Theatre of Harlem, Miami City Ballet, and The Ailey School in New York City. Ingram started his professional career with Alvin Ailey's Second Company (Ailey II) and later became a founding member of Space T.U. Embrace project. Ingram has received numerous choreographic and artistic awards including the National Foundation for the Advancement in the Arts (NFAA) Gold medalist and the U.S. Presidential Scholar in the Arts.

Over the course of Ingram's professional performative career, he has danced with the following companies: Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Armitage Gone!, Dallas Black Dance Theatre, Lion King Las Vegas, Lion King on Broadway, and Walt Disney World's Festival of the Lion King. In addition, he has collaborated with and performed works by Alvin Ailey, Dwight Rhoden, Alonzo King, Martha Graham, Judith Jamison, Twyla Tharp, Karole Armitage, Earl Mosley, Troy Powell, and Peter London.

As a dancer, choreographer, and teacher, Ingram strives to innovate the boundaries of traditional dance techniques by merging the strengths and dimensions of classical ballet and contemporary movement. Ingram has set works on Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Dallas Black Dance Theatre, Lion King Las Vegas, Ballet Noir, Dance Black Dance Theatre II, and numerous dance studios nationwide. As of 2014, he has toured and performed in Tokyo, Paris, London, Scotland, Freeport, Singapore, Beijing, Shanghai, St. Petersburg, Milan, and the United States.

Ingram is currently based in the Dallas region. In 2014, Ingram co-founded 6 o'Clock Dance Theatre with Marielle McGregor to produce innovative and unique contemporary ballet at elite levels of artistic excellence. In addition, he is on faculty as part of Southern Methodist University.



Lonnie Hightower | Choreographer

Dallas native, Lonnie Hightower III, is an all-around classically trained artist in voice, piano, musical theater and multiple disciplines of dance. He began his training as a pre-teen. Classical Voice Training under master teachers Dr. Harris and Ms. Celestine Williams, and Ms. Rose his Classical Piano teacher. His excellent training was rewarded with his middle school enrollment in Greiner Arts Academy where he subsequently received the Stevie Ray Vaughn Musician Award and Mr. Hightower was on his way!

During his attendance at Booker T Washington HS for the Performing and Visual Arts he received dance training from renowned dance masters Ann Reinking (Jazz), Gregory Hines (Tap), John Parks (African and Modern), Lily Weiss (Modern), Vanessa Williams (Musical Theater) and many more teachers of note. It was during this time his choreographic artistry was recognized with the bestowal of the US Presidential Scholar in the Arts. Mr. Hightower's unique and soul-filled choreography was performed at the prestigious John F. Kennedy Performing Arts Center in Washington, DC where President Bill Clinton presented him with the Gold Medallion.

Following Mr. Hightower's enrollment at the prestigious California Institute of the Arts, he toured as a principal dancer in Dallas Black Dance Theater 1st Company, NY Baroque and Contemporary Ballet Dallas. He was also a featured singer on American Idol and competitor on So You Think You Can Dance. While performing in the Disney Festival of the Lion King, he was

commissioned to create a dance piece for the opening of Georgia O'Keefe's exhibit in at the Phillips Collection in Washington, DC which was hailed by critics and those in attendance.

In addition to performing, Mr. Hightower's focus has turned to teaching and choreography. He became Assistant Director at Power House of Dance in Dallas – out of which grew a student-based dance ensemble, the Dancers Unleashed Dance Company. Under Mr. Hightower's direction, DUDC is a multi-award and competition winning company, a force to be reckoned with.



Tyrell Rolle | Choreographer

Tyrell has been mentored by some of the most influential dancers of our times one being Judith Jamison. She gave him the confidence he needed to move on to the next levels of his career. Growing up Tyrell had a hard childhood. From living in an under-served community, and being labeled as a slow learner in school. He loved to dance and had an undeniable artistic side that was inevitable. This played a role in his new mission of giving that chance to other kids that mirror some of his struggles. Tyrell founded and recently launched, "The Rolle Project" housed in his "Studio 305". The First youngest African American male Dance Director at charter school 100 academy school of excellence.

Mr.Rolle was selected to judge the 2021 Miss Miami Broward Pageant and also the 2022 Mrs. American Pageant at the Westgate Hotel. Mr.Rolle was also selected to choreograph for B2K Millennium tour at MGM Grand Casino and choreographed for the Mrs. American pageant at The WestGate hotel. Mr.Rolle was a featured Guest Choreographer for CCSD Dance Festival in Las Vegas, NV. Mr.Rolle was the Head Choreographer for Shea Moisture event hosted by Essence Magazine.Mr.Rolle also teaches at IABD (International Blacks in Dance Conference), Armour Dance Theater, Jazz Millennium Dance Complex,LVA Performing Arts High School,Thurman White, CSN Community College, Del Sol Magnet Program and coaches at Canyon springs high school dance line and now is currently re-launching an After school program in Las Vegas 2023-24.

Mr.Rolle holds the title Shining star for Fox 5 Las Vegas and the Act of kindness recipient and Miami Proud.Mr.Rolle also received a proclamation from the city of Las Vegas. He was also the Director of music & art with Girl Power nonprofit organization in Miami working with young girls to build confidence, competence and pride within themselves while working in New York with Dynamix works as a guest teacher.

This season 2023-24 Mr.Rolle is choreographing a full length work production Titled The Red Swan Ballet and Alice Finds Wonderland. Mr.Rolle was also selected to choreograph for Caesars Entertainment Black History program and Also highlighted by North Las Vegas for Non Profit Business of the month. He loves teaching in every city and currently is accepting bookings for master classes, workshops and choreography.His long-term goals is to be an accredited school for dancers and artists after high school. He wants to spread The Rolle Project across the world with the mission of the organization. He is also looking for to working with UNLV next Fall 2023/24.




Sarah Wales | Choreographer

Katherine Cornell is from Dallas, Texas, and graduated with honors from The University of Texas at Austin with a B.F.A. in Dance and a B.B.A. in Management Information Systems in December 2021. Katherine was in the Omega Chapter of Alpha Phi Sorority at UT Austin and is currently a member of the Alpha Phi Dallas and Suburban Community Alumnae Chapter. For her full-time job, Katherine works at Charles Schwab Headquarters in Enterprise and Operational Risk Management. Throughout her dance career, Camille had the privilege of working with and learning from artists such as Emanuel Gat, Gabriel Speiller, Maleek Washington, Hailey Von Schlehenried, Madison Hicks, Sidra Bell, Troy Ogilvie, Kevin Parjarillaga, and Emily Bernet + Taylor Kinsey. She attended multiple movement research workshops with Moving Forward Dance, enjoys collaborative spaces, and has taken dance classes in Europe.
